SUMMARY OF DISCUSSION

Agenda Item	Action Recommendation
I. Approve Minutes	Approved June minutes.
II. Study and Action Group Debrief	Well-attended groups with good presentation and discussion. Two weeks of meeting then a final meeting on the third week. Split into two group due to high sign up.
III. Future Meetings	We will cancel our August meeting. Meet at our usual time for September and October. Meet 12/13/16, 1/10/17, and 1/24/17. We will discuss our November meeting in September.
IV. Next Year's Holiday celebration	CHS Theater and Leticia Nieto are both available for 1/16/17. Both are reserved. The event will be from 6-8 pm. We are discussing with partners if there would be interest in a workshop on 1/17/17.
V. Annual Report Review	A draft of the KLAB annual report was reviewed. It was approved.
VI. Books follow up	The library does not have a system where we can sponsor a shelf, but the display case could be used to highlight an event and we could donate books and publicize they are there in other ways. We could put together a list of King related books.
VII. Role of KLAB	We discussed our advisory role and areas we might want to advise. There will be continued opportunities

	with the city and county visioning processes. There was interest expressed in housing and homeless issues, law enforcement, economic inequality, renaming, and public accommodations.
VIII. Renaming revisited	There was interest in revisiting the renaming discussion. The city has a policy on naming public places. There was interest in beginning with a process and criteria for renaming, generating a list of names to change, and a list of positive names to honor. OSU has begun some of this work for the campus. There was also interest in the social justice tour of Corvallis to think about positive naming ideas. There are also potential overlaps with the Historic Resources Commission and we should reach out to them as we move ahead.
IX. Scholarship	The theme for this year's contest will be: Imagine Corvallis in 2040. Submissions can be any media (essay, art, poetry, video, song, etc.). Deadline for submission is 12/5/16.
X. Announcements	Everyone has participated in the 2040 vision survey. It is open through August. Indigenous People's Day will be proclaimed again this year at the Native American Longhouse on October 10 at 4 PM.
