January 8, 1900

- read and filed report of Chief of Police 526
- referred to Street Committee petition of A. Peterson to open alley through Block 29 in County Addition, remonstrance of R. H. Huston and W. Bouge against petition, and petition of T. Case to open alley through Block 28 in County Addition 526
- referred to committee petition requesting sidewalk construction along parts of Harrison Street 526
- granted M. Schmidt's petition asking Council to remit unused part of saloon license 526
- approved liquor license bonds of Kriens and Smith – H. M. Brunk, J. W. Stewart sureties, and Kirk and Wiley – G. G. Horning and Thomas Callahan sureties; instructed Police Judge to issue licenses 526
- referred to Fire and Water Committee issue of buying new hose and providing hose drier 526

January 22, 1900

- read certificate of V. E. Waters showing amount of assessable property within City Limits to be \$552,800 527
- resolution adopted – levy for general municipal purposes five mills on each dollar upon all property real and personal assessable within City for 1899 and levy additional one mill on all said property as street fund for 1899 527

February 12, 1900

- resolution adopted – instruct Police Judge to draw warrants for payment of \$100 each to E. E. Wilson and H. C. Watson for services as attorneys in case of Corvallis Water Co. vs. City in full to date 528
- Street Committee reported adversely to petitions of A. F. Peterson and T. C. Case to open alley west of Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 in Block 29 and Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 in Block 28 in County Addition by submitting opinion of Attorney M. E. Yates regarding petition 528
- accepted Street Committee's report and ratified its action that it had allowed removal of rails from railway upon payment of \$140 to Street Fund and had contracted with Charles Blakeslee to give him the lumber to remove from the streets 528
- Fire and Water Committee reported it had no definite report regarding purchase of hose; referred back to Committee issue of purchasing hose 529
- read and filed report of Chief of Police 529
- referred to Street Committee petition of W. S. McFadden, Lee Henkle, and others for sidewalk on east side of Lots 1 and 2 in Block 3 in Rayburn's Addition 529
- approved Mayor sending letters on behalf of Council to each Oregon Congress member asking them to use their best efforts to secure an appropriation to finish construction work on the Willamette River a short distance above Corvallis 530

March 12, 1900

- heard and accepted Fire and Water Committee's report that the City not purchase hose at that time 531
- filed report of Chief of Police 532
- referred to Finance Committee reports of Police Judge and Treasurer 532

- referred to Finance Committee issue of beautifying City Park 532
- referred to Street Committee petition of P. Bilyeu, V. H. Wagner, and others for a sidewalk and petition of W. R. Hansel, H. W. Gurnishaw, P. Bilyeu, and others asking Council to open for travel(?) certain portion of 16th Street 532
- authorized Finance Committee to employ Attorney to assist in matter of issuing \$10,000 bonds 532

April 9, 1900

- instructed Chief of Police to have alleys and streets cleaned 533
- instructed Street Committee to confer with College Sewer Committee and have contract entered into as per agreement 533
- referred to Street Committee petition of Lofe Stewart, A. Bunker, and others for sidewalk along west side of Lots 7, 8, 9, 11, and 12 in Block 7 in Dixon's(?) Second Addition 533
- resolution adopted – construct a sidewalk along south side of Lot 1 in Block 19 in County Addition and instruct Chief of Police to serve notice upon owner of land to construct sidewalk 534
- ordinance adopted – submit to vote of qualified electors of City proposition to issue and sell bonds to pay general indebtedness of City in sum not exceeding \$10,000 534
- instructed Police Judge to give notice of annual City election to be held May 21, 1900 534
- designated Council Chambers in City hall as voting place for annual City election 534
- appointed Caleb Davis, W. Cees, and John H. Simpson judges and E. R. Bryson and J. H. Gibson clerks of annual City election 535

May 14, 1900

- read and filed report of Chief of Police 536
- referred to Street Committee, with power to act, petition of City Transfer Co. for \$20 per month for sprinkling 536
- took no action regarding petition of J. A. McFadden requesting reduction of auctioneer's license 536
- filed communication from Christian Anderson and J. F. Leven? 536
- instructed Police Judge to sign contract on behalf of City with Oregon Agricultural College granting College right to connect its sewer with sewer on Jefferson Street upon certain conditions mentioned in contract 537
- referred to Street Committee, with instructions to investigate, issue of the City and Benton County purchasing a gravel bed 537

May 26, 1900

- read communication from Ward 3 Councilor H. M. Hall regarding him having moved from Ward; motion to postpone electing councilor to fill vacancy until first regular meeting in June lost; elected S. G. Kline to fill vacancy 538
- County Judge Woodward spoke to Council regarding purchase of gravel bar 538
- administered oath of office to S. G. Kline 538
- approved purchasing gravel bar jointly with Benton County; referred to Street Committee matter of arranging details of purchase 538
- allowed petition of City Transfer Co. for \$21 per month for sprinkling Second Street 538
- referred to Fire and Water Committee issue of placing new door in City jail 539

May 29, 1900

- ordinance adopted – authorize Police Judge to enter into contract with County Court to govern use of gravel bar and purchase grounds of Sol King for same in conjunction with Benton County 539

June 4, 1900

- read and approved liquor license bonds of B. Woldt – N. B. Avery, John Rickard sureties, Thomas Whitethorn – J. M. Porter, John Smith sureties, and J. G. Wuestefeld – P. N. Zieulf, Aug Hodes sureties; instructed Police Judge to issue licenses 540
- elected P. Avery Council President 540

June 11, 1900

- referred to Street Committee issue of purchasing Sol King's gravel bar 542
- referred to Benton County bills for putting ferry boat in condition; instructed Police Judge to draw warrants for payment of one-half of amounts when approved by County 543
- referred to Finance Committee reports of Police Judge, Treasurer, and Chief of Police 543
- read and filed bonds of Police Judge and Treasurer 543
- referred to Finance Committee issue of insuring old engine house 543
- approved petition of Young America Engine Co. asking for \$50 for prizes for hose contest on July 4th 543
- deferred to Street Committee and Attorney issue of making changes in size of pipe on Jefferson Street sewer 543
- referred to Fire and Water Committee petition of Fire Company to have fire apparatus in condition 543
- referred to Fire and Water Committee matter of re-organizing Fire Department 543
- referred to Street Committee petition of J. T. Phillips, John Smith, and others for sidewalk along south side of Madison Street 543
- elected C. B. Wells night policeman 543

June 12, 1900

- instructed Police Judge to draw warrant for \$500 in favor of Sol King for City's portion of purchase of gravel bar, payment to be made when deeds delivered to City and Benton County; instructed Attorney to certify in writing to Benton County Clerk that City was satisfied with title to land known as "Sol King gravel bar" 544
- resolution adopted – order and direct Police Chief to serve notice upon owners of specific properties to construct sidewalks 544

July 5, 1900

- required contractor to furnish bond of \$250 for two years for replacing any of the Jefferson Street sewer pipe cracked or broken at that time, should such sections of pipe give way or get out of place within two years 545
- accepted Jefferson street sewer 545
- motion to pay contractor for disputed 100 feet of Van Buren Street sewer failed 545
- referred to Street Committee final amount of payments to contractor (for sewer?) 545

July 9, 1900

- adopted committee's report of \$4.48 difference between City engineer's and contractor's estimates 546
- instructed Police Judge not to deliver warrant for payment of sewer until Street Committee approved bond to be given to repair any cracked or broken pipe that may give way in next two years, nor until said Committee was satisfied there was no lien on pipe in sewer 546
- read and filed report of Chief of Police 548
- referred to Street Committee petition of S. P. Hunt to have alley in 14 County Addition (Block 14 in County Addition?) opened 548
- read and approved liquor license bond of Kirke and Maley and bond of Smith and Krievs – M. H. Brunk and H. W. Hall sureties; instructed Police Judge to issue licenses 548

• authorized Councilman W. J. Wilbanks to confer with County Judge regarding purchase of a skiff for ferry boat	552
• ordinance to prohibit firing or exploding of firecrackers, bombs, torpedoes, or any other explosives within City Limits read first and second times	552
• ordinance adopted – prescribe composition of Fire Department, officers, officer election, time of election, bills auditing, and violations of ordinance and rules of department; enact rules and regulations; provide for reports of chief engineer; letting of contract; and referral of certain resolutions printed under caption "Concerning the Fire Department"	553
• ordinance to permit B. F. Irvine to erect wooden building within fire limits read first time and referred to Attorney	553
• resolution adopted – instruct Chief of Police to serve notice in manner required by provisions of Ordinance No. 85 upon owner(s) of specific properties to repair or construct sidewalks	553
• instructed Police Judge to present bill to Oregon Agricultural College for its portion of Jefferson Street sewer	554

• granted Attorney further time to report on S. P. Hunt's petition to open alley	555
• Attorney reported that B. F. Irvine could be allowed to construct wooden building within fire limits only if ordinance establishing fire limits was amended or replaced entirely; postponed action until next meeting	555
• ordinance adopted – provide for time and manner of constructing sewer and necessary catch basins, manholes, lampholes, and branches along center of alley through Block 4 in County Addition and Block 14 in Dixon's Second Addition from main sewer in Van Buren Street to point in center of alley in Block 14 in Dixon's Second Addition, approximately 50 feet south of south line of Taylor Street; describe district to be drained by sewer; and specify that properties benefitted by sewer would pay for sewer construction, per City Charter Sections 119 and 127	555
• appointed committee to estimate proportional share of costs of approved sewer to be assessed to owners of properties benefitted thereby, per City Charter Chapter 119	557

• ordinance adopted – provide for time and manner of constructing sewer with necessary catch-basins, manholes, lampholes, and branches along center of alley through Blocks 22 and 23 in County Addition and across Jackson Street from main sewer on Van Buren Street to a point 36 feet from north side of Monroe Street; describe district to be drained by sewer; and specify that properties benefitted by sewer would pay for sewer construction, per City Charter Sections 119 and 127	558
• appointed committee to estimate proportional share of costs of approved sewer to be assessed to owners of properties benefitted thereby, per City Charter Chapter 119	559
• ordinance to provide for time and manner of constructing sewer with necessary catch-basins, manholes, lampholes, and branches along center of alley through Blocks 28 and 29 and across Adams Street in Avery's Second Addition from main sewer on Jefferson Street to north side of Washington Street; describe district to be drained by sewer; and specify that properties benefitted by sewer would pay for sewer construction, per City Charter Sections 119 and 127 read first time	559

- referred to Finance Committee reports of Police Judge and Treasurer 572
- granted petition of C. A. Covell and others for crosswalk at Seventh and Tyler Streets and for sidewalk along west side of Seventh Street between Harrison and Tyler Streets (along Lots 1, 2, 3, and 4 in Block 2 in Rayburn's Addition) 572
- resolution adopted – construct sidewalk along east side of Lots 1, 2, 3, and 4 in Block 2 in Rayburn's Addition; direct Chief of Police to serve notice upon owners of identified lots or parcels to construct sidewalk 572
- resolution adopted – construct sidewalk along east side of Lots 1 and 2 in Block 3 in Rayburn's Addition; direct Chief of Police to serve notice upon owners of identified lots to construct sidewalk 572
- referred to Finance Committee petition of teachers of public schools asking Council to regulate street parades 572
