January 14, 1901

- accepted Finance Committee report that it scheduled time to meet with petitioners regarding regulating street parades but failed to meet, and nothing was done 574
- granted Finance Committee further time to report matter of attorney fees in case of Corvallis Water Co. vs. City 574
- read communication from H. C. Watson, one of City's attorneys in case involving Corvallis Water Co., regarding his fees in case 574
- read and referred to Finance Committee report of Chief of Police 575
- read and approved liquor license bond of Kirke and Wiley – John Richard and Thomas Callahan(?) sureties; instructed Police Judge to issue license 575
- referred to Fire and Water Committee petition of A. Stavelle(?) and others for electric light at Fifth and Madison Streets 575
- referred to Street Committee petition of J. Y. Underwood and others for sidewalk along Blocks 1 and 2 in Chase's Addition 575
- read clerk's certificate indicating amount of taxable property in City as \$520,205; motion to establish levy for municipal purposes at 5 mills and for street purposes at 1 mill lost (Mayor broke tied vote) 575
- resolution adopted – levy for general municipal purposes five mills on each dollar upon all real and personal property assessable within City Limits for year 1900 and levy an additional one mill on same property for street fund for year 1900 576
- instructed Attorney to prepare ordinance to repeal bill-posting ordinance 576
- referred to Street Committee matter of road to dumping ground 576
- left to Councilmen Heckart and Smith matter of repairing City Hall roof 576

February 4, 1901

- Police Judge read notice calling special meeting 577
- read and referred to Attorney petition of R. L. Buchanan, E. Woodward, and others and petition of Mrs. P. O. Wilson, Lucy Francisco, and others to have Charter amended regarding construction of sewers 577
- appointed and referred to committee matter of amending Charter to aid enterprises 577
- referred to Attorney matter of legality of City aiding a free ferry across Willamette 577

February 8, 1901

- adjourned for lack of quorum 578

February 11, 1901

- received and accepted special committee's report against amending City Charter at the time 579
- received and adopted Street Committee's report recommending against granting petition of J. Y. Underwood and others for sidewalk in Chase's Addition 579
- Fire and Water Committee reported favorably on petition of A. Standlee and others for electric light at Fifth and Madison Streets 579
- instructed Police Judge to deduct \$21.60 from bill of Corvallis Water Company, with interest on same for a month, the amount being due the City on judgment held by City against Water Company 579

- read and filed report of Chief of Police 580
- granted petition of M. C. Miller and others asking Council to remove accumulation of manure between Hotel Corvallis and brick livery stable; instructed Chief of Police to have parties putting manure in area immediately remove same 580
- received Finance Committee's report that it reviewed work of attorneys E. E. Wilson and ? Watson in case of Corvallis Water Co. vs. City and recommended paying Mr. Wilson \$300 and Mr. Watson \$200 and allowing \$20 for incurred expenses; "considerable discussion"; postponed action 580
- ordinance to repeal Ordinance No. 65 (license and tax bill posters and everyone distributing advertisements – passed by Council August 12, 1895, approved by Mayor August 13, 1895) read first and second times 581

February 18, 1901

- instructed Police Judge to draw warrants in favor of attorneys E. E. Wilson (\$200) and H. C. Watson (\$150) less amounts for \$600 each already drawn to their order 582
- read communication from Corvallis Water Co. 582
- read and approved liquor license bond of E. H. Paul – H. M. Brunk and H. W. Hall sureties; instructed Police Judge to issue license 582

March 11, 1901

- instructed Police Judge to cancel judgments held against Corvallis Water Co. by City 583
- accepted Attorney's report opining that defendant in case of City vs. Lee Daw(?) in Police Court could not appeal; read communication from J. W. McFadden, attorney for defendant 583
- read and filed report of Chief of Police 584
- read and referred to Finance Committee reports of Treasurer and Police Judge 584
- ordinance adopted – repeal Ordinance No. 65 (license and tax bill posters and everyone distributing advertisements – passed by Council August 12, 1895, approved by Mayor August 13, 1895) 584
- elected J. B. Irvine policeman for period of six months to serve without compensation from City – duties: maintain order in building commonly known as Corvallis Opera House and prevent any person disturbing any meeting, gathering, or performance of any kind in said building 584
- received presentation from County Judge E. E. Woodward regarding repairing City and County ferry; referred matter to Street Committee to have ferry repaired; Judge Woodward, on behalf of County, agreed to pay one-half repair expenses 585
- referred to Fire and Water Committee petition of W. C. Buchanan, O. J. Trees, and others for electric light at 11th and Harrison Streets and petition of T. J. Thorpe, M. C. Thorpe, and others for electric light at 16th and Harrison Streets 585
- referred to Fire and Water Committee and Street Committee petition of T. J. Thorpe, M. C. Thorpe, and others for sidewalk to be built along north side of Harrison Street from 16th Street to City Limits 585
- J. T. Philleby(?) asked Council to have saloons be closed on Sundays; approved Chief of Police having saloons keep closed on Sunday 585

April 4, 1901

- received, accepted, and filed Finance Committee report that books of Police Judge and Treasurer were examined and deemed correct 586
- received, accepted, and filed Fire and Water Committee's report recommending that action regarding petition for electric light at 11th and Harrison Streets be postponed 586
- read and filed report of Chief of Police 587
- read and accepted resignation of night policeman C. B. Wells 587

- elected George Emerick night policeman 587
- read and referred to Street Committee petition of S. P. Hunt(?) requesting that alley in Block 14 in County Addition be opened
- referred to Street Committee petition of J. J. Cady, M. L. Adams, and others requesting sidewalk in Wilkins Addition 587
- granted petition of Benton County Citizens League requesting aid in printing pamphlet; instructed Police Judge to draw warrant for \$50 for printing 588
- ordinance adopted – amend ordinance establishing and fixing compensation of certain officers and employees of City 588
- ordinance to amend Section 1 of an ordinance to provide for prevention and removal of nuisances and punish those who allow or maintain them (passed by Council September 16, 1891; approved by Mayor October 15, 1891) read first time 588
- approved Health Committee inspecting city and causing all nuisances to be abated 589
- ordered Police Judge to give usual notice of upcoming City election 589
- appointed M. Jacobs, W. Crees, and Caleb Davis judges and J. Y. Underwood and J. Y. Ripley clerks of annual City election 589

May 13, 1901

- received and adopted Street Committee's report recommending opening of alley in Block 14 in County Addition; instructed Chief of Police to have alley opened 590
- ordinance to provide for prevention and removal of nuisances failed 591
- allowed City Transfer Co. \$20 per month for street sprinkling 591
- resolution adopted – order Chief of Police to serve notice upon owners of specific lots or parcels to have sidewalks repaired 591
- authorized Mayor to appoint ten-citizen committee to travel to Portland to meet President McKinley during visit to area 592
- instructed sewer committee to investigate when citizens desired sewers 592

May 18, 1901

- adjourned for lack of quorum 592

- read and approved liquor license bonds of Thomas Whitethorn – J. M. Porter and John Smith sureties, B. Woldt – N. B. Avery and John Richard sureties, and J. G. Wuestefeldt – P. N. Zierolf and A. Hodes sureties; instructed Police Judge to issue licenses 593
- read and referred to Finance Committee quarterly report of Police Judge 593
- read and ordered printed annual report of Police Judge 593
- read and referred to Finance Committee reports of Treasurer and Chief of Police 593
- received retiring Mayor J. W. Crawford's annual message 593
- administered oath of office to newly elected Mayor M. S. Woodcock, elected Councilmen, and newly elected Chief of Police A. B. Alexander
- read and accepted bonds of A. B. Alexander as Chief of Police – Rebecca Alexander and E. W. Strong sureties 593
- referred to Finance Committee bonds of E. P. Greffoz as Police Judge and W. McLogan 593
- Mayor Woodcock read message 593
- resolution adopted – bonds of Chief of Police be fixed at \$2,000 594
- appointed sewer committee to Board of Health 594
- elected P. Avery Council President 594

June 10, 1901

- received and accepted Finance Committee's report that bonds of Police Judge and Treasurer were satisfactory; approved bonds 595
- instructed Chief of Police to open alley in Block 14 in County Addition 597
- read petition from E. T. Bryant, P. M. Zierolf, and others requesting a hydrant at Polk and Second Streets 597
- read and referred to Fire and Water Committee for investigation communication from F. P. Shasquin, Chief of Corvallis Fire Department, recommending purchase of new fire house and placing two more fire hydrants in city 597
- read applications for night watchman; elected J. J. Fleet night watchman 597
- elected W. E. Yates Attorney 597
- approved Council paying "that portion in crossing the streets of all lateral sewers that they may order(?) built at the expense of the adjacent property" 597

July 8, 1901

- Fire and Water Committee reported receiving bids on hose; Council action postponed 598
- report of Chief of Police was postponed because it was misplaced by Police Judge 599
- resolution adopted – costs and expenses (\$20.93) of constructing sidewalk along east and north sides of Lot 4 in Block 15 in Jobs Addition be assessed against said lot 599
- resolution adopted – costs and expenses (\$14.45) of constructing sidewalk along north side of Lot 5 in Block 15 in Jobs Addition be assessed against said lot 599
- read and approved liquor license bond of Kirke and Nailey(?) – C. Read and Thomas Callahan sureties; instructed Police Judge to issue license 600
- read communication from Gordon V. Skelton regarding surveying and preparing plans for lateral sewers; referred matter to committee on sewers, with power to act 600
- received presentation from ? Farr, president of Corvallis Water Co., regarding additional fire hydrants; after discussion, instructed Fire and Water Committee to confer with Corvallis Water Co. to reach understanding to secure for City a better supply of water 600
- referred fire hose bids and samples to Fire and Water Committee and Chief Engineer 600
- referred to Fire and Water Committee matter of changing lights in Council Chambers 600

- appointed committee to examine roof of City Hall 602

• read and granted petition of M. M. Davis, J. M. Nolan, and M. E. Lee, owners of two-thirds of property in Block 15 in Old Town, asking Council to construct lateral sewer through said Block, to be paid for by property owners of said Block	610

- received report and presentation by Attorney W. E. Yates regarding not writing complaint against A. Assell for violating Sunday closing ordinance when requested to do so by Chief of Police A. B. Alexander; Council discussed matter but took no action 610
- instructed Attorney to prepare ordinance for construction of lateral sewer through Block 15 in Old Town 611
- referred to Fire and Water Committee petition of Mrs. Cora Hartley, Mrs. D. W. Prichard, and others for electric light in front of free reading rooms 611

October 28, 1901

- read communication from B. F. Hyland regarding sewer through Block 15 in Old Town 612
- elected J. B. Irvine as policeman to maintain order in and about building known as opera house and to serve without receiving compensation from City for services as such officer 612
- ordinance adopted – provide for time and manner of constructing sewer, together with necessary catch basins, manholes, lampholes, and branches, along middle of alley of Block 15 in Original Town of Marysville and across Adams Street from main sewer on Jefferson Street to north line of Block 4 in Original Town of Marysville; sewer to be paid for by property benefitted by construction of sewer, provided by City Charter Sections 119 and 127 612

November 11, 1901

- granted Street Committee further time to report regarding fixing crosswalks 614
- adopted Fire and Water Committee report against putting electric light in front of reading room 614
- read and filed report of Chief of Police 615
- opened and referred to sewer committee (with power to act) single bid received for constructing lateral sewer through Block 15 in Old Town – J. R. Smith & Co. to build sewer for \$448.75 615
- read and approved liquor license bonds of Thomas Whitethorn – John Smith and J. M. Porter sureties, J. G. Wuestefeld – P. M. Zierolf and H. Hodes sureties, and B. Woldt – John Richard and N. B. Avery sureties; instructed Police Judge to issue licenses 615
- read unsigned(?) protest against social club giving dances in fireman's hall; approved to allow no more dances in fireman's hall except by Council permission 616
- placed care of City Hall in charge of Chief of Police until next regular meeting 616
- referred to Street Committee matter of building sidewalk along east side of Lots 1, 2, and 3 in Block 19 in County Addition 616

December 9, 1901

- sewer committee reported it awarded contract to build lateral sewer through Block 15 in Old Town to J. R. Smith & Co. 617
- read, adopted, and filed reports of Police Judge, Treasurer, and Chief of Police 618
- granted petition of Corvallis Choral(?) Union to use Fireman Hall to practice 618
- committee from ladies' coffee club asked what meeting, if any, they could hold in firemen's hall; after discussion, Council members informed committee of no objection to ladies having gathering in hall except dancing; instructed Chief of Police to furnish committee with a key to the hall; instructed Chief of Police to furnish firemen with key to hall and keep one himself 618
- referred to Street Committee matter of placing electric light on Madison Street between City Hall and Second Street 618
- referred to Fire and Water Committee matter of providing greater safety from fire and accidents to people in building known as Corvallis Opera House 618
- accepted invitation of ladies' coffee club to attend reception on New Year's Day 618
