- corrected December 11th minutes to indicate that repair of sewer in block abutting Dr. H. S. Pernot's residence was to be done at expense of property owners 155
- corrected December 26th minutes by striking out all references to matters related to levying tax for ensuing year 155
- Mr. Gray, representing Oregon Electric R. R. Company said he conferred with County Court and Corvallis Businessmen; as soon as something tangible could be agreed upon with Court regarding use of bridge across Willamette River at Corvallis, a proposition would be submitted to Council consideration for franchise privileges; Judge Charles Carey spoke on same subject 155
- Ways and Means Committee submitted report 155
- Ordinance No. *** adopted – establish tax levy for 1912 157
- instructed Chief of Police to secure a dog pound(?) 159
- approved Mayor and Attorney conferring with County Court regarding caring for patients with contagious diseases 159
- Mayor read annual message to Council 160

January 15, 1912

- Mr. Hall, representing Portland, Eugene, and Eastern Railroad said he had a franchise to present to Council and hoped Council would pass same 160
- ordinance to grant to Portland, Eugene, and Eastern Railroad Company, a corporation of Oregon, its successors and assigns, a franchise to construct, maintain, and operate a street railroad, together with poles, wires, and other appurtenances upon, over, along, and across certain specified public streets in city; grant to Company, its successors and assigns, franchise for construction, maintenance, and operation of commercial railroad upon same streets and agreeing with grantee upon extent, manner, and terms of its use thereof; fix terms of one of said franchises and terms and conditions of both; prescribe duties, powers, privileges, and obligations of grantee under each franchisee, providing for forfeiture and prescribing method of declaring and exercising same read first and second times and referred to Ordinance Committee 160
- received Sewer Committee's report regarding lateral sewer through Block 9 in Original Town of Corvallis; sewer stopped up back of Dr. Pernot's residence to such an extent that water was flowing back into basements of houses along sewer line; under Committee's direction, Engineer excavated down to sewer and found cause of stoppage was due to roots of Lombard poplar trees growing immediately to rear of Dr. Pernot's house and on Mrs. John Smith's property; sewer at these locations was defectively constructed in that sufficient cement was not used to entirely fill up all joints, thus allowing tree roots to find their way into the barrel of the sewer; without trees, stoppage probably would not have occurred; had joints been properly cemented, tree roots would probably not have interfered with sewer; based upon circumstances, Committee believed and recommended repair expenses (\$66) should be borne one-half by Dr. Pernot and Mrs. John Smith and one-half by City 161

- read and referred to Sewer Committee, with instructions too prepare necessary resolutions, etc., petition for lateral sewer in 25th Street from Van Buren Street to College Campus 162
- Ordinance No. 358 adopted – provide for issuing improvement bonds for assessments in Assessment District No. 8 163
- Ordinance No. 359 adopted – provide for issuance and sale of improvement bonds for bonded assessments in Assessment District No. 7 164
- Ordinance No. 360 adopted – provide for issuance and sale of improvement bonds for bonded assessments in Assessment District No. 6 165
- Ordinance No. 361 adopted – provide for issuance and sale of improvement bonds for bonded assessments in Assessment District No. 10 165
- Ordinance No. 362 adopted – issue and sell improvement bonds for bonded assessments in Assessment District No. 9 166
- Ordinance No. 363 adopted – previously approved improving Monroe Street from Ninth Street to 31.02 feet west of Kings Road, the western portion of said Monroe Street sometimes referred to in Benton County deed records as "the County Road leading from Corvallis to Kings Valley (via G.P. Wren's)"; ten percent of cost to be paid by City from money to be raised by issuing and disposing of City bonds and 90 percent of cost to be assessed and borne by property specially and peculiarly benefitted thereby according to relative benefits of improvement to several parcels of property so benefitted, assessments not to exceed special and peculiar benefits; determined probable cost of improvement and apportioned 90 percent of cost among parcels of property directly benefitted 167
- Ordinance No. 364 adopted – adopt surveyor's report on opening, laying out and establishing extension of 13th Street from Van Buren Street to Monroe Street 169
- Ordinance No. 365 adopted – adopt surveyor's report, plat, and surveys on opening, laying out, and establishing new street (widening of part of Webber Avenue in Wells and McElroy Addition)
- resolution adopted congratulate Councilman Irvine on his long, active, and energetic service as City Councilman 170

February 5, 1912

- read and referred to Sewer Committee, with instructions to prepare necessary resolutions, etc. leading to construction, petition for lateral sewer through Block 4 in Rayburn's Addition from Tyler Street northward to main sewer 171
- read and adopted Sewer Committee's report – report filed with Municipal Judge referred back to Committee; Committee fully considered situation regarding construction of lateral sewers and discussed matter with Engineer, who reported that by next Council meeting, he would have work of his office in shape to be ready to take up work of lateral sewers and believed it possible for his office to handle practically all of the lateral sewers to be constructed and connected(?) with new main sewer; recommended Council declare it their belief that all lateral sewers located in streets and all lateral sewers passing through center of blocks where rights of way were completely obtained be constructed during coming summer and steps be taken so said work may proceed promptly; include with sewers where right-of-way obtained any sewers for which right-of-way may be obtained before passage of the first resolution calling for plans and specifications for said sewers; if rights-of-way for other sewers obtained during coming spring, proceedings be taken at a later date regarding construction of said sewers at one time; recommended that Council declare intention to institute suits to condemn rights-of-way for all sewers located through the center of blocks, providing said rights-of-way were not obtained and conveyed to City prior to July 1, 1912 171

- License and Fines Committee and Fire and Water Committee, acting jointly, reported having examined conditions of Corvallis, Occidental, and Julian Hotels and found Corvallis Hotel not equipped with a fire escape; recommended that Corvallis Hotel be required to construct two fire escapes – one in front and one in rear, one of which to be constructed to permit firemen to go onto roof; recommended that hall door of Corvallis Hotel be caused to open outward, according to provisions of statutes in such cases; recommended that proprietors of each hotel place red lights, surrounded by globe, painted on same in black letters the words "fire escape," in all hallways in front of doors of all rooms leading out to fire escapes or as near thereto as reasonable possible; recommended changes be made in opera house to guarantee better protection against fire but requested additional time to investigate same 172

- Ordinance No. 366 adopted – repeal Ordinance No. 272 (provide for taxing, impounding, and killing dogs) 173
- Ordinance No. 367 adopted – repeal Ordinance No. 324 (amend Section 1 of Ordinance No. 272 – provide for taxing, impounding, and killing dogs running at large) 173
- Ordinance No. 368 adopted – provide for health committee and health officers and define their powers, duties, and authority; provide for establishing and enforcing quarantine and disinfection, prescribing conduct of persons to prevent spread of diseases and establishing regulations to secure cleanliness and avoid diseases and prescribe penalty for violation of terms of ordinance 174
- Health Officer Dr. H. S. Pernot spoke about existing conditions regarding contagious diseases 175
- motion to refer to Ordinance Committee Ordinance No. 369 to provide for granting a franchise over certain streets to P. E. & E. R. R. Co. lost 175
- Ordinance No. 369 read section by section and amended by interlineation; approved publishing ordinance 175
- considered proposals for purchase of improvement bonds in Assessment District Nos. 6, 7, 8, 9, and 10; Warren Construction Company submitted bid deemed highest and best bid; accepted Warren Construction Company's bid 175
- resolution adopted – Oregon Legislative Assembly at 1911 session appropriated \$9,000 or so much thereof as might be necessary for purpose of paying one-half of 90 percent of cost of improving Monroe Street; Legislative act provided that Council, by resolution, declare said portions of Monroe Street were paved with a hard pavement; declared that portions of Monroe Street were paved with hard pavement for total cost of \$18,548.72, and 90 percent of one-half of cost is \$8,346.88 176
- authorized Mayor, Health Officer, and Health Committee to employ a special health officer to regulate contagious diseases in city 177

 - entrance to gallery open directly onto sidewalk with stairways running straight from upper floor to walk
 - one exit seven feet wide be placed near center of building on south side with substantial steps; substantial steps be built at existing exit on south side of building
 - good brick flue be constructed from ground 12 inches by 12 inches inside measurements
 - all electric switches be placed in metal- or asbestos-lined cases
 - smoke pipe leading from furnace be covered with asbestos
 - woodwork above furnace be protected by asbestos covering
 - one exit be provided in rear of stage
 - opening above main curtain in attic be boarded up but provided with doorway
 - front curtain be made of asbestos
 - all exits be indicated with red lights with globes on which was painted in plain block letters the word "exit"
