

Using a Barbeque Grill in Chintimini Park Event Venues

Your Barbeque Grill Permit requires that your barbeque equipment be in good working order and use standard fuel sources. Any deviation from this is grounds for the immediate revocation of your permit.

Grill Placement:

- Barbeque equipment must be at least 15 feet away from buildings and other fixed structures and equipment.
- Your grill cannot be used under tree canopies or other vegetation.
- The City staff person on duty must approve the placement of your grill.

Fire Risk Management:

- To manage the risk of fire, a fire extinguisher and a water bucket will be provided to you as part of your Barbeque Grill Use Permit. Place both of these items near your grill.
- If you are using a grill that uses briquettes as fuel, you will be provided with an ash can, in addition to the fire suppression equipment.
- In the event of fire, please:
 - Notify the City staff person of the fire – they will choose the best method of extinguishing it.
 - If the City staff person is not immediately available, stay calm and carefully extinguish the fire by:
 - Grill fire: use the fire extinguisher on the fire in the grill (using the method described in the instructions on the extinguisher). **DO NOT USE WATER ON YOUR GRILL** – grease and water are a dangerous combination
 - Grass fire (sparked by embers from the grill): Use the water from the bucket on any sparks that have escaped to the surrounding area..
 - After the fire is out:
 - With the City staff person, inspect your equipment thoroughly for any sign of damage.
 - If there are any signs of damage, you will not be allowed to reignite your grill.

After Grilling is Done:

- Notify the City staff person that you are finished using your grill.
- Extinguish your grill and allow it to cool.
- If your grill produces ash, please let your ashes cool as much as possible, scoop them into the ash can provided by the Center, then notify the City staff person that the ashes are ready for disposal.
- Do not place any heated materials (such as hot oil, food residue, etc.) in the garbage cans or recycling containers.
- If you clean your grill before your departure, do not discard any waste materials from the grill in the event space (grass or pavement).
- You are responsible for removing your grill and any other barbeque equipment from the Park before the end of your rental time.
- Once you have removed your grill from the Park, notify the City staff person, so they can inspect the area and collect the Senior Center's fire risk management equipment.
